MA Audubon recently endorsed plans by the timber industry, state energy agencies and US Forest Service to pass legislation for public subsidies to increase logging and biomass burning of private forests in Western Massachusetts through the "Mohawk Trails Woodlands Partnership" (MTWP). **NJ Audubon** received \$648,000 in USDA Federal Grants to write logging plans (euphemistically called "Forest Stewardship Plans") for publicly owned high conservation value forests in the Highlands Region of New Jersey (<a href="www.maforests.org/2017NJ-FOIA.pdf">www.maforests.org/2017NJ-FOIA.pdf</a>). They also received \$140,000 from a private hunting club to write a logging plan for Sparta Mountain public forests (<a href="www.maforests.org/Audubon3.pdf">www.maforests.org/Audubon3.pdf</a>). NJ Audubon has a "Memorandum of Agreement" with NJ DEP which prohibits sharing information about public land logging plans with the public.
